The matters before the Board this afternoon are setting the final millage and approval of the final budget.

The resolutions to come before the Board are as follows; Resolution 2022-77. Resolution of The Children's Trust of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopting the final millage rate for levying of ad valorem taxes for The Children's Trust of Miami-Dade County, Florida for fiscal year 2022 to 2023; and declaring the percentage change in the property tax levy as defined under section 200.065, Florida Statues and providing for an effective date.

And Resolution 2022-78, resolution of The Children's Trust of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopting the final budget for fiscal year 2022 to 2023, providing for an effective date.

A state law mandates that the first item for discussion is a resolution 2022-77, setting the final millage necessary to fund the budget, as well as a

1 discussion of the specific purpose for which ad 2. valorem tax revenues are being used. I'll turn it over to our CEO for a little bit of 3 4 explanation. 5 Mr. Chair, thank you. This will be MR. HAJ: 6 our 20th budget year for The Children's Trust, the final millage rate to be levied in order to produce 7 8 sufficient ad valorem taxation revenue, which will be 9 adequate to pay the appropriations in the budget for 10 the fiscal year beginning October 1st, 2022, and 11 ending September 30th, 2023, shall be .5 mills. 12 The final operating millage rate of .5 mills 13 will result in a property tax increase of 11.38 14 percent, which is more than the roll-back rate of 15 .4489 mills. 16 The roll-back rate is the millage rate that 17 would generate approximately the same amount of 18 property tax revenues as approved for the prior year. 19 Last year's actual property tax levy for The 2.0 Children's Trust is \$165,010,266. This year's 21 proposed ad valorem tax revenue estimate at 95 22 percent of the ad valorem tax levy of .5 mills is 23 \$180,468,238. 24 The purpose of this levy and the resulting 25 increase in the budgeted ad valorem tax revenues over

families in our community.

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1 the prior years enable the Trust to expand service to 2. children and families while aligning to the strategic 3 plan. 4 Since the beginning of the last five -- this 5 five-year funding cycle effective 10/1/18, the Trust has committed an additional \$188.8 million dollars 6 7 over a five-year cycle. The five-year commitment 8 continues to emphasize the importance of program spending provides critical services for children and 9

> The Trust also increased the following program budget categories in support of Board priorities which is two million for early childcare, one million for youth development, 600,000 health and wellness, \$4,300,00 in family and neighborhood supports, and one thousand -- one million dollars in program professional development.

> The total budgeted program service is \$171,344,548 and the highlight of the 2023 budget reflects a general expense management expense of 6.62 percent of Trust total expenses.

In Trust history, this is the largest budget investment in program services.

My address is 2810 8 Northwest 97th Street, Miami, Florida, 33147. 9 These are my partners, or colleagues. 10 To the esteemed Board Members of The Children's 11 Trust, I hope all is well. 12 I am Terry Joseph, co-chair of the Equity and 13 Advocacy Collective, better known as EAC. 14 The EAC is a collaboration of community-based 15 organizations that advocate the equitable 16 distribution of all funds, goods, and services 17 available to improve the lives of children and 18 families of color throughout Miami-Dade County. 19 The members of the Equity and Advocacy 2.0 Collective are Bellafonte Talcolcy Center, The Center 21 for Family and Child Enrichment, Concerned African 22 Women, The Family Christian Association of America, 23 Gang Alternative, Girl Power, Liberty City Trust, New 24 Horizons, Community Mental Health Center, Overtown 25 Children and Youth Coalition, Overtown Youth Center,

1 Saint La Haitian Neighborhood Center, and Team Upward 2. Bound. The EAC was formed over seven years ago as a 3 4 result of series of conflicts between the black 5 community-based organizations and The Children's 6 Trust, due to a blatant lack of communication, lack 7 of amenable provider funded partnerships, as well as 8 well as efforts to eliminate black-run operator 9 organization from funding via a biased RP process. 10 However, the EAC stands before you today to 11 publicly recognize that the current The Children's 12 Trust Management and Staff, under the direction of 13 Jim Haj, has changed the narrative. 14 They go above and beyond to nurture positive 15 funder provider relationships with EAC. 16 While we might not get everything we want, we 17 truly appreciate Jim and his team's willingness to 18 listen, and genuinely include service providers in the decision-making process at The Children's Trust. 19 It is a breath of fresh air. 2.0 21 And with that, God Bless, you all stay safe, 22 keep up the good work, Jim, because we'll let you 23 know if you start messing up again. 24 Everybody take care. 25 PASTOR DUNN: I can't pass this up, Mr.

The Children's Trust grant for the last eight or nine years, and with that, it's been such a great help for us, because we have -- we're -- like, I said, we're serving the underserved, and quite a few of our -- our families, are -- they just can't afford it, and what they ended up doing was, going over the TCTPT program after - coming out and actually registering for the school readiness program.

So those that are over income, the parents are being helped now, they've pitched them over to the TCT side, The Children's Trust side, which helps us a great deal, because a lot of our parents, although they may be over income, they still cannot afford to do childcare and take care of everything else in the family.

And most of our families, are two to three children, and -- in there, they have may have a pretty decent job, but it's very, very hard for them to keep up.
